Decoding Christmas Fr. Bijumon Thomas CSC

Once again, it's Christmas, the season filled with hope, joy, faith and love. Christmas fills our hearts with anticipation. For some, it's a time to celebrate with festivities, including colourful decorations, shopping and outings. For others, it's a season of deeper spiritual preparation, a time for repentance and drawing closer to God. Yet, for some, it may feel like just another day of the year.

In this context, Christmas holds special significance for each of us at St. Louis Parish. How we perceive Christmas has a profound impact on our personal, parish and family lives. The evangelists described the birth of Christ in a dramatic way: darkness enveloped the world, and then a light shone. The good news was announced to the shepherds, a multitude of heavenly hosts praised God and the wise men from the East followed the star in search of the King of the Jews to pay him homage. On the other hand, King Herod and his followers sought to kill the newborn, leading to the tragic loss of many innocent lives. For some, it was a moment of hope, joy, and adoration; for others, it was a moment of bewilderment, fear, and unbelief.

As believers, what do we see in Christmas, if not the "littleness" of God - a scandalous truth? It is Baby Jesus, truly God and truly man, coming to us as one of us. The Creator of heaven and earth, who embraces the cosmos, is held in the hands of human beings. The one who placed the sun now needs the warmth of the manger; tenderness incarnate must be coddled. The infinite and unconditional love of God is contained in a tiny heart that beats softly. The omniscient and omnipotent God is a homeless infant. The Bread of Life needs to be nurtured.

Christmas turns everything upside down - God enters the world in littleness. This paradox challenges us to ask ourselves: can we accept God's way of doing things? He reveals Himself in the ordinariness of life, yet we often fail to recognize Him.

Therefore, as Christians, we should ask Jesus for the "grace of littleness" this Christmas. As Pope Francis expressed in one of his Christmas vigil homilies: "Lord, teach us to love littleness. Help us to understand that littleness is the way to authentic greatness."

नाताळ समजून घेणे

पुन्हा एकदा, नाताळ आला आहे, आशा, आनंद, विश्वास आणि प्रेमाने भरलेला हंगाम पुन्हा आला आहे. नाताळ आपले अंतःकरण अपेक्षेने भरतो. काहींसाठी, रंगीबेरंगी सजावट, खरेदी आणि सहलीसह उत्सव साजरा करण्याची वेळ आली आहे. इतर काहींसाठी, हा पश्चात्ताप करून, देवाच्या जवळ येण्याचा, सखोल आध्यात्मिक तयारीचा काळ आहे. तर काहींसाठी हा वर्षातील आणखी एका दिवसा सारखा दिवस आहे.

या संदर्भात, संत लुईस धर्मग्रामात आपलया प्रत्येकासाठी नाताळला विशेष महत्त्व आहे. नाताळ सणाची आपली समज आपल्या वैयक्तिक, धर्मग्रामीण आणि कौटुंबिक जीवनावर खोल प्रभाव पडते. सुवार्तिकांनी ख्रिस्ताच्या जन्माचे नाटकीय वर्णन केले आहे: जगात अंधार पडला आणि एक प्रकाश दिसला. मेंढपाळांना ख्रिस्तजन्माची बातमी घोषिविली जाते, स्वर्गीय दूत देवाची स्तुती करतात आणि पूर्वेकडील ज्ञानी लोक यहद्यांच्या राजाच्या शोधात त्याला मुजरा करून, भेटी वाहण्यासाठी ताऱ्याच्या मागे येतात. दुसरीकडे, राजा हेरोद आणि त्याच्या अनुयायांनी नवजात बालकांना जीवे मारण्याचा प्रयत्न केला, ज्यामळे अनेक निष्पाप जीवांचे दुःखद नुकसान झाले. काहींसाठी तो आशेचा, आनंदाचा आणि आराधनेचा क्षण होता; तर इतरांसाठी, तो गोंधळाचा, भीतीचा आणि अविश्वासाचा क्षण होता.

श्रद्धावंत लोक म्हणून, आपण नाताळमध्ये काय पाहतो, जर आपण देवाचा "लहानपणा" पाहत नाही तर मग एक निंदनीय सत्य पाहतो, हा बाळ येशू आहे, खरा देव आणि खरा मणुष्य, आपल्यापैकी एक जो आपल्याकडे येत आहे. स्वर्ग आणि पृथ्वीचा निर्माता, जो ब्रह्मांडाला आलिंगन देतो, त्याला मानवांनी हातात धरले आहे. ज्याने सूर्य घडवला त्याला आता गोठ्याची ऊब हवी आहे; देवाचा अवतार ज्याला आलिंगणाची गरज आहे. देवाचे असीम आणि बिनशर्त प्रेम जे एका लहानशा हृदयात सामावलेले आहे ते हळूवारपणे धडकते. सर्वशक्तिमान देव एक बेघर शिशु आहे. जीवनाच्या भाकरीला पालनपोषणाची गरज आहे.

नाताळ सर्वकाही उलथून टाकतो - देव लहान बालक होऊन जगात प्रवेश करतो. हा विरोधाभास आपल्याला स्वतःला प्रश्न करण्यास आव्हान देतो: आपण देवाची कार्य पद्धती स्वीकारू शकतो का? सामान्य व्यक्तीच्या रूपात तो स्वतःला प्रकट करतो, तरीही आपण त्याला ओळखण्यात अपयशी ठरतो.

म्हणून, ख्रिस्ती या नात्याने, आपण या नाताळच्या हंगामात येशूकडे "नम्र होण्याची कृपा" मागितली पाहिजे. पोप फ्रान्सिस यांनी त्यांच्या नाताळच्या जागरणविधीच्या एका प्रवचनात सांगितले आहे: "प्रभु, आम्हाला लहान आणि नम्र होऊन प्रेम करायला शिकव. नम्रता आणि लहानपणा हा अधिप्रमाणित महानतेचा मार्ग आहे हे समजण्यास आम्हाला मदत कर." **फा. बिजुमोन थॉमस**

AUGUST

Vianney Sunday: The feast of St. John Marie Vianney, patron of priests, was celebrated at all masses on August 11. Parishioners expressed appreciation and affection to the parish fathers, who were later presented with bouquets.

Deanery Faith Formation: As many as 20 Sunday School students from Class 5 and 6 participated in the deanery faith formation session on August 18.

St. Louis Feast: The novena to our patron, St. Louis, was held in Marathi and English from August 17 to 24. Preachers from other parishes enlightened parishioners with their homilies. Stalls, offering delicious snacks, were put up by the sectors. The feast masses on August 25 were at 8 am in Marathi and 9.30 in English.

SEPTEMBER

Feast of the Nativity of Our Lady: The novena was held in Marathi and English from August 30 to September 7. The 7 pm mass was animated by the Sunday School children. They offered love offerings, which were later handed over to orphanages and old age homes.

Nativity Stalls: From August 30 to September 7 the youth set up vibrant stalls and conducted interesting games each day.

Monthi Fest: This was celebrated on September 15, with a special mass, followed by a cultural program in Konkani and traditional lunch.

नाताळ किंवा ख्रिसमस हा एक प्रमुख ख्रिस्ती सण असून दरवर्षी २५ डिसेंबर रोजी येशू ख्रिस्ताचा जन्मदिन म्हणून जगभर साजरा केला जातो. रोमन सम्राट कॉन्स्टंटाईन यांच्या काळात ३३६ मध्ये पहिल्यांदा नाताळ म्हणजेच 'ख्रिसमस' साजरा केला गेला.पोप ज्युलियन यांनी २५ डिसेंबर रोजी येशू ख्रिस्ताची जयंती साजरा करण्याचा निर्णय घेतला होता. नाताळ हा खिस्ती लोकांचा सण असला तरी सर्व धर्मीय आणि संस्कृतीचे लोक तो उत्साहाने साजरा करतात. बायबलच्या नवीन करारात नोंदवल्याप्रमाणे नाताळचा इतिहास येशू ख्रिस्ताच्या जन्माशी जोडलेला आहे. २५ डिसेंबरपासून दिवस मोठे होऊ लागतात म्हणून हा दिवस सूर्याचा पुनर्जन्म असा मानला जातो आणि यामुळेच युरोपियन लोक २५ डिसेंबरला उत्तरायणाच्या दिवशी सण साजरा करत असत. या दिवशी ख्रिस्ती लोक एकमेकांना विविध भेटवस्तू, शुभेच्छा पत्रे देऊन परस्परांचे अभिवादन करतात तसेच घरांना रोषणाई करून घर सजवले जाते. नाताळ वृक्ष सजावट ' ख्रिसमस ट्री ' नाताळसाठी सजवलेले सूचिपर्णी झाड हा या सणाचा अविभाज्य घटक आहे. या दिवशी सांताक्लॉज लहान मुलांसाठी भेटवस्तू वाटतो असे मानले जाते. या मध्ये अनेक गोड़ पदार्थांचा समावेश असतो.

देवाने गालीलातील नाझरेथ नावाच्या गावी राहत असलेल्या जोकिम आणि आन्ना या दाम्पत्याच्या पोटी एका निष्कलंक कुमारिकेला जन्म दिला. पवित्र मरियेचा जन्म ही मानवाच्या तारणाची मंगल पहाट होती. वयात आल्यावर जोकिम आणि आन्ना यांनी आपली सुकन्या जोसेफ नावाच्या सुताराला दिली. दोघांची सोयरीक झाली परंतु विवाह सभारंभा आधीच मारिया गरोदर असल्याचे दिसून आली. ती पवित्र आत्म्याच्या योगे गर्भवती झाल्याचे गाब्रियलदूताने स्वप्नातील दर्शना द्वारे योसेफाला सांगितले. मोठ्या आनंदाने त्याने मारियेला आपली पत्नी म्हणून स्वीकारले. योगायोगाने त्याच वेळी सीझर ऑगस्टस याने सार्या जगाची नावानिशी लिहिली जावी अशी आज्ञा केली. जोसेफ हा बेथलेम या गावचा असल्याने त्याने आपल्या वाग्दत असलेली मारिया हिलाही आपल्याबरोबर घेतले. तेथे सर्व उतारशाळा (धर्मशाळा) भरल्या होत्या. त्यामुळे गाईच्या गोठ्यात त्यांनी आसरा घेतला. तिथेच मारियेने आपल्या पुत्राला जन्म दिला. कॉन्स्न्टटाईन या रोमन सम्राटाने या सुमारास ख्रिस्ती धर्म स्वीकारला. त्याने ख्रिस्ती धर्माला प्रोत्साहन देण्यासाठी २५ डिसेंबर हा दिवस रोमन कॅथॉलिक ख्रिस्त सभेत येशू ख्रिस्ताचा जन्मदिवस म्हणून साजरा केला.

असे म्हणतात की त्या वेळी संत फ्रान्सिस असिसी याने पवित्र मिस्सा अर्पण केली व लोकांना भावस्पर्शी प्रवचन दिले. त्या प्रवचनाच्या शेवटी या संतांच्या हातात खरोखरच एक जिवंत बालक अवतरल्याचे लोकांनी पाहिले. त्या मुळे गोशाळा उभारण्याच्या प्रथेला बळकटी मिळाली. कॅथॉलिक ख्रिस्तसभेमध्ये ख्रिस्तजन्माची स्मृती म्हणून गोशाळा किंवा गायीचा गोठा तयार करण्याचा प्रघात आहे. ही परंपरा संत फ्रान्सिस असिसिकर यांनी १२२३ साली सुरू केली. ग्रेसिओ नावाच्या एका लहान गावा जवळ असलेल्या गुहेमध्ये त्याने गाय, उंट, मेंढरे, गाढवे इ. आणून असा देखावा निर्माण केला. ही प्रथा गावातील लोकांनी पूर्वापार चालू ठेवली आहे. अकराव्या व बाराव्या शतकात खिसमस कॅरोल किंवा नाताल गीतांची प्रथा जर्मनीत सुरू झाली. दहाव्या शतकात ख्रिसमस ट्री सजवण्याची परंपरा सुरू झाली. अशा प्रकारे नाताळ किंवा ख्रिसमस हा सण ख्रिस्ती लोकांसाठी एक महत्वपूर्ण सण होऊन ख्रिस्तावरील श्रद्धा वाढविण्यास कारणीभूत ठरला. आपणा सर्वांना ख्रिसमस सणाच्या हार्दिक शुभेच्छा.

Goencho Saib - St. Francis Xavier

St. Francis Xavier (1506–1552), whose real name was Francisco de Jasso y Azpilicueta, was a Spanish Catholic priest and one of the founders of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Born in Navarre, Spain, he studied at the University of Paris, where he met St. Ignatius of Loyola and became one of his closest collaborators. Known as one of history's greatest missionaries, he was sent by Pope Paul III to spread Christianity in Asia.

Francis Xavier began his missionary work in Goa, India, in 1542. Over the next decade, he traveled to several countries, including Malaysia, Indonesia, and Japan, preaching the Gospel and establishing Christian communities. His approach emphasized learning local languages and respecting native cultures, which helped him connect deeply with diverse populations.

In Japan, he introduced Christianity and gained several converts despite significant challenges. His final mission aimed to spread Christianity in China, but he fell ill and died on Shangchuan Island near the mainland in 1552.

Canonized in 1622, St. Francis Xavier is venerated as the patron saint of missions and missionaries. His feast day is celebrated on December 3. He is remembered for his courage, humility, and tireless dedication to spreading the Christian faith across the world.

The mostly-incorruptible body of the Saint is now in the Basilica of Bom Jesus in Goa, where it was placed in a glass container encased in a silver casket on 2 December 1637. This casket, constructed by Goan silversmiths between 1636 and 1637, was an exemplary blend of Italian and Indian

aesthetic sensibilities. There are 32 silver plates on all four sides of the casket, depicting different episodes from the life of our beloved Saint.

In Selfless Service to the Poor and Needy

The St. Vincent de Paul (SVP), St. Louis Conference is functioning since July 1997. It presently has 25 members and meets every Thursday, at 7 pm, at St. Louis church to discuss strategies, plan activities and report on the weekly family visits.

The SVP has 21 adopted families, both Catholic and non-Catholic. Monthly rations are provided to them. Medical and educational aid is also given to needy members and those who approach the conference. The Parish clergy assists in the smooth functioning of the conference.

Every week SVP members visit the adopted families to enquire about their well-being and assist them if they are facing any problems. The visit reports are discussed in the weekly meetings.

Message of the Holy Father Francis for the 39th World Youth Day 2024

'Those who hope in the Lord walk without tiring (Is 40:31),' says the Holy Father.

'Last year we set out on the path of hope towards the Great Jubilee by reflecting on Saint Paul's words, "Rejoice in hope" (Rom12:12). In order to prepare ourselves for the Jubilee pilgrimage of 2025, this year we can take inspiration from the prophet Isaiah, who says: "Those who hope in the Lord... will run and not be weary" (Is 40:31).

'Today, we live in times marked by dramatic situations that generate despair and prevent us from looking to the future with serenity: the tragedy of war, social injustices, inequalities, hunger and the exploitation of human

beings and the natural environment. Often the ones who pay the highest price are precisely young people. You sense the uncertainty of the future and are not sure about where your dreams will lead. In this way, you can be tempted to live without hope, as prisoners of boredom, depression and even be drawn to risk-taking and destructive behaviours. For this reason, dear young people, I would like the message of hope to come to you, as was the case with Israel in Babylon. Today too, the Lord is opening a highway before you, and he invites you to set out on it with joy and hope.

The pilgrimage of life and its challenges 'The prophet Isaiah speaks of "walking without tiring". Let us reflect then on these two realities: walking and tiredness.

'It is normal that, while we set out on our journeys with enthusiasm, sooner or later we will begin to feel tired. In some cases, anxiety and inner fatigue are brought on by social pressures, the need to attain certain levels of success in our studies, our work and our personal life. This tiredness is often accompanied by a certain ennui, the apathy and dissatisfaction that affects those who never set out, choose, decide, take risks, preferring to remain in their own comfort zone, closed in on themselves, seeing and judging the world from a distance, without ever "dirtying their hands" with problems, with other people, with life itself.

'The solution to tiredness, oddly enough, is not to stand still and rest. It is to set out and become pilgrims of hope. This is my invitation to you: walk in hope!
